The Security Deposit is negotiable with the NS Power representative you are speaking with. It might be a twomonth deposit for the typical power costs of the apartment. "Bad credit" does not affect your ability to access power. You can not be denied a power account because of bad credit. However, the cost of the security deposit may need to be negotiated. • Try to phone NS Power 10 days before you move into the home. Sometimes there is a delay in power setup.
